Facing the Oume Kaido (Oume Road), the gate is more than 95 feet wide and almost 18 feet deep. This gate also consists of the largest house on the property which contained the Nezu Residence. The gate reflects the social environment at the beginning of the Showa Fra.

(Old Main House)


This house was completed in 1933 and was the residence of Kaichiro Nezu who also managed his rail empire from the property. The latest techniques were used in its construction, including a concrete foundation, fire hydrants, boiler heating systems, and buried electrical wiring.

The Storehouse

This three-story building is 34 feet high and is made entirely of wood, an anomaly in this area. It contains several displays depicting the Nezu family.

Kaichiro Nezu was born at on June 15th, 1860 in Yamanashi-city to a farmer.

He held positions such as a clerk of the city office, an assembly member, and the mayor.

He got to know Shuhei Wakao and Keijiro Amemiya in Tokyo in the 1900s, and then made "Koshu Zaibatsu" (Koshu means "Yamanashi" and "Zaibatsu" means financial conglomerate). In 1905 he assumed the Presidency of Tobu Railway co. Itd. and restored its finances.

In his belief that he had to return the profit that he got from the society to the society, he ran the educational business, and he founded Musashi senior & junior high school in Nerima, Tokyo.

Especially, he contributed to promoting the Education and Culture in Yamanashi prefecture as he donated 200 pianos and sewing machines to all the elementary schools in Yamanashi. He is a honorary citizen of Yamanashi-city.

Nezu Memorial Museum is the mansion of Nezu family used as the guest house, management office, and living house.

The tenement house Gate, the Old Main house and the threestory Storehouse are tangible cultural assets designated as such by the government.
